As most of you know we worked throughout the lock-down. Both the shop and the post office counter were very busy in the early weeks but now things have returned more to normal. All the usual services are available and the shop and post office hours remain unchanged - Monday to Saturday 7am to 7pm and Sunday 8am to 12noon.

The shop provides a range of groceries, Lottery, scratch-cards, gas and electric top-ups, etc. At the Post Office, in addition to dealing with letters and parcels we offer banking (depositing cash and cheques, cash withdrawals and balance checks), benefits and pensions, mail redirection, catalogue returns, local collect, bills payment, mobile phone top-ups, Parcel Force, money grams and fishing licences. We also pay out the big wins on the Lottery from the post office counter.

Meetings of the Parish Council on 20th August and 8th September 2020

Spire View Footpath

The Parish Council has agreed to make a contribution of £1,950 to the cost of surfacing the footpath from Spire View to the canal tow-path – to meet the standard of a Public Right of Way. This is on condition that the county council and the Bathurst Estate also contribute.

Planning

The Parish Council considered various matters arising from the outline permission, granted at Appeal, for the erection of up to 88 dwellings at **Severalls Field**, Park Way, Siddington. The Council agreed that the proposed provision of two drop-off spaces for the school was wholly inadequate and a larger drop-off point for the school to alleviate congestion on the Coach Road was needed. There had also been some doubt over the associated provision of a new assembly hall for the school. Regarding a condition re footways/ cycleway, the Council agreed that other paths in the parish such as the remainder of the old canal tow-path were in greater need of upgrading than the footpath from Pound Close to the church.

Bus Shelter & Seating

The new bus shelter at Elizabeth Way is scheduled for installation on 1st October.

Park Way

Thanks to Highways for the gully clearance and installation of a new culvert under the road on the bend – hopefully an end to the flooding issues.

Wildflower Planting at the Playing Field

The Council approved a project for planting some areas of wildflowers on part of the bank at the back of the playground and near the hedge on the eastern boundary. Ground preparation and sowing is scheduled for October. Any offers of volunteer help to the parish clerk please.

NOTE: Due to the pandemic, **physical meetings of the parish council are not taking place** until further notice; the meetings are taking the form of conference telephone calls. Details of how the public may 'attend' are published with the agenda on the parish council website and on the notice board outside the post office.

Lucy, the pub manager writes: We are really pleased to have reopened with our new Covid rules and structure in place. We are open Wednesday to Sunday (closed Monday and Tuesday). We are operating with a smaller capacity but as of 23rd September will have an outside marquee with outside heaters, able to accommodate up to an extra 6 tables.

The feedback we've had from all our customers has been very positive and we look forward to having many more people from the village visiting us over the coming months.

We've made some changes to be Covid secure, so do please adhere to our guidelines and ensure a safe and enjoyable time for all our guests and our team. **Some key points:**

- * Please check the opening times as they may have changed (see the website – <https://www.thegreyhound-inn.co.uk/>).

- * Booking is highly recommended for both eating and drinking. To secure your space – see contact details above.
- * We can accommodate tables of up to 6 persons maximum – a legal requirement. The time a table can be booked for might be restricted – please check when booking.
- * Groups of 6 may now be from multiple households.
- * If your group is larger than 6 we may be able to take your booking but the group will have to be split across a number of tables. Tables cannot exceed 6, guests cannot mix between tables and all furniture must be kept in place.
- * A host or team player will meet you at the door.
- * The lead booker must give their contact details along with the size of the group. This is a legal requirement and we will refuse entry if these details are not given. This will be recorded in our Test and Trace system. Your details will be stored securely and then destroyed after 21 days.
- * The host will take you to your table; there is no service at the bar. We have table service, an order point or you can download our app. This will all be explained to you.
- * There will be social distancing signage throughout the pub and entrances and exits clearly signalled.
- * We have gone cashless. You can pay through the app, with a card or through your mobile. We have increased contactless to £45.
- * Children need to be with you at all times.
